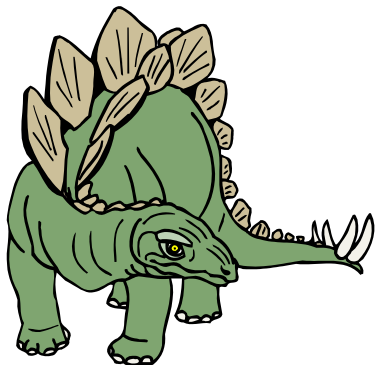


If you are unfamiliar with Camp Tuttle an opportunity to visit the camp and celebrate its opening is Saturday, June 16. Details are forthcoming.
